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BACKGROUND TO SCHOOL PERFORMANCE DATA

This information package presents summary data for schools which had Year 12 students in 2007.

It should be noted that the period 2007 to 2009 is a transition time when students can achieve a WACE by studying combinations of TEE and WSA subjects and new WACE course units. During this period participation in WSA subjects will decline as new courses replace these subjects. For this reason comparison of WSA statistics prior to 2007 with later years needs to be carefully interpreted as, invalid and erroneous conclusions could be drawn. The 2007 data includes achievement in English, Engineering Studies, Media Production and Analysis and Aviation.

The data are about the performance of students at schools and should not be used to draw simplistic inferences about the performance of schools. The following general qualifiers should be recognised:

- Many factors affect student performance, some of which are outside the control of schools. These include differences in ability, cultural and language background, educational background of parents and economic differences.
- No single table or data source should prevail in drawing inferences about the performance of students at schools. A more realistic picture is gained from a composite view of all tables.
- The statistics of a single year should not be considered in isolation, rather the trend or pattern over a number of years should be considered.
- Small numbers of candidates at a school can bias inferences, particularly with percentages.
- The quality assurance processes associated with the TEE/WACE course examinations data ensure consistent information from year to year and from school to school. Whereas the non-TEE/WACE course school data are not subject to the same processes.

The data that have traditionally been of interest to the community are the proportions, at each school, of

- all students who achieve a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE);
- students who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and who achieved a scaled mark above 75;
- students who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and who achieved an average scaled score in the top third (high tertile) of the state;
- Vocational Education and Training (VET) students who completed a full VET qualification; and
- Wholly school-assessed (WSA) students who achieved at least one A grade.

There are two sets of tables presented.

1. The first five tables identify the first 50 schools, in rank order, for each of the five criteria mentioned above.
2. The second set of tables lists all schools, in alphabetical order, for each of the five criteria mentioned above.

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DATA HIGHLIGHTS

Year 12 population

- In 2007, 21,186 Year 12 students undertook studies towards the WACE. This is an increase of 5.7% on the 20,035 in 2006.
- In 2007, there was a 26.0% increase in the number of students repeating or re-entering Year 12 (from 316 in 2006 to 398).
- In 2007, the number of mature age Year 12 students increased by 6.7% (from 450 in 2006 to 480).

Secondary graduation (WACE)

- Of the 21,186 (20,035 in 2006) Year 12 students, 19,121 (18,817 in 2006) full-time students were eligible to graduate.
- In 2007, 96.0% of eligible students graduated. This is an increase of 0.1% from 2006.

VET

- In 2007, 30.4% of Year 12 students participated in VET programs.
- In 2007, 3,037 full VET qualifications were awarded to Year 12 students, compared with 2,249 in 2006.
- In 2007, there was a 6.9% increase in the number of Year 12 students who participated in VET programs and achieved a full VET qualification (from 2,249 in 2006 to 3,037)
- In 2007, the 385 Year 12 students achieved a Certificate II in Business. This was the most popular qualification achieved in 2007 (347 achieved it in 2006).

TEE/WACE course examinations

- In 2007 of 10,757 TEE students, there were 4,531 (42%) in public schools and 5 860 (54%) in independent and Catholic schools, while 366 (3%) were overseas or private candidates.
- 55.65% of WA's Year 12 students studied four or more TEE/WACE course examinations, compared to 52.16% in 2006. This represents a 3.49% increase in the number of 2007 Year 12 students who sat the TEE/WACE course examinations in at least 4 subjects and were therefore eligible for a TER.
- In 2007 there were 2,509 Year 12 students who had at least one scaled mark 75 or above. In 2006, there were 2392.
- In 2007, 648 students studied at least one of the new courses, Aviation, Engineering Studies and Media Production and Analysis. Scores from these now contribute to the university entrance. At least 488 used scaled scores from these courses in their TER calculations.

Wholly school-assessed (WSA) subjects

- In 2007, there were 7,116 (8,306 in 2006) Year 12 students who completed 3 or more WSA subjects, which is 14.3% less than 2006. Enrolment in WSA subjects will continue to drop.
- Nearly 22% of Year 12 students participated in structured workplace learning during 2007, which is less than 2006, and will continue to decrease due to the introduction of endorsed programs.

WACE courses

- 16,776 Year 12 students completed at least 2 new WACE course units; of these, 99% achieved a level 4 or better in the course unit. The majority of these students studied two units of English.

Endorsed programs

- 415 Year 12 students enrolled in at least one endorsed program.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander achievement

- 87.6% Year 12 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students achieved a WACE.

FIRST 50 TABLES

The following tables present five of many different ways to represent the relative performances of students at different schools. These tables do not contain information about the 'value adding' of schools to each of their students over their years of senior secondary schooling. A school may appear in none of these tables but may have significantly improved individual student achievements for the majority of its students during these years beyond what may have been expected.

Each way of presenting data has its limitations, and inferences drawn from these tables must be made cautiously. For example, and in relation to the 75+ table, a school may have a large number of students with scaled scores of 74, but no students with a scaled score above 74, and hence the school will have no chance of appearing in this table. Thus, failure to appear in this table does not imply that students at this school have not performed well.

1. First 50 graduation schools

This table shows the number of students in each school who graduated as a percentage of all students eligible to graduate. To be eligible to graduate, students must have had the opportunity to complete the Curriculum Council requirements to receive a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE). In some instances, students may be included in the eligible to graduate statistic even though these students have a very limited capacity to achieve graduation. An example of this may be a foreign exchange student who is completing a full suite of WACE subjects/courses but who will be unable to achieve English language competency.

2. First 50 TEE/WACE course examination schools (75+)

This statistic is based on the calculation of the number of students in the school who achieved a scaled mark of above 75 in one or more subjects/courses. This count of students makes no distinction between those who achieved at this level at one or several subjects (e.g. a student who achieved 4 scaled marks above 75 is included in the calculation once only). This number is then converted to a percentage of the students in the school who completed 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations. Schools with 12 or less students in the TEE/WACE course cohort are not included.

The table recognises schools which have a high proportion of students who have achieved the excellent result of a scaled mark of above 75. The scaling of the marks, that is, the adjustment of student marks according to the relative difficulty of the subject/course, means that in some subjects/courses students must achieve very high marks to have a scaled score above 75.

3. First 50 TEE/WACE course examination schools (Top third)

This table is based on the percentage of students who completed 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and achieved an average scaled score in the top third of averaged scaled scores. The average scaled mark of a student recognises consistent performance. Because each student's marks are averaged, a single high mark will not be sufficient to be included. Good results in other subjects/WACE courses are required. This table ranks schools according to the percentage of students in the high third (tertile). The percentage for each school gives the proportion of TEE/WACE course examination students who achieve an average scaled mark in the high tertile.

4. First 50 VET Schools

This table shows the percentage of VET students in a school who completed a full VET qualification. Schools are ranked according to the percentage. It should be noted that the achievement of a VET qualification requires students to complete clusters of units of competency, and that only certain qualifications – such as those offered at the Agricultural Colleges – lend themselves to the full completion of a VET qualification. For this reason, most VET students record a partial completion. These students complete units of competency that can be used toward the completion of a full VET qualification at a later date. Schools with 10 or less students enrolled in VET courses have been omitted.

5. First 50 WSA Schools

This table shows the percentage of students who studied three or more WSA subjects and scored an A in at least one of these subjects. These subjects do not have an external examination component and do not contribute to university entry. The grades for WSA subjects are awarded at the school level through moderation procedures of the Curriculum Council. Most students who complete 3 or more WSA subjects will not complete 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations. Thus this statistic will in almost all cases represent the achievement of different students than in the TEE/WACE course examinations achievement tables. In general, these students will be seeking career opportunities or further TAFE studies that do not include university as an immediate goal.

This statistic is based on the calculation of the number of students in the school who achieved an A grade in one or more subjects. It recognises the first A grade that an individual student achieved but does not indicate where multiple A grades may have been achieved. This number is then converted to a percentage of the students in the school who completed 3 or more WSA subjects.

First 50 Graduation Schools

Total – number of full-time students eligible to graduate.

This column refers to the number of full-time Year 12 students eligible to graduate. The students must have results for at least four full-year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects (or equivalent) in the current year, and in addition is eligible to graduate. A 'result' in a subject means the awarding of one of the grades A B, C, D, E, or U (unfinished). A 'result' in a course unit means the awarding of a level and band or U (unfinished).

Eligible to graduate in the current year means that a student would graduate if he or she obtained a grade in all current year subjects/course units. This includes students with results from every year on record, and students who have Year 11 equivalent achievements.

Graduated – number of full-time students eligible to graduate who graduated.

This column refers to the number of full-time students who completed graduation requirements. Graduation means 'achievement of a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)'. To qualify for a WACE a student must:

- complete at least 10 full year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects (or equivalent);
- obtain an average grade of C or better in at least eight of the full year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects (or equivalent). At least four of these subjects must be at Year 12 level; and
- achieve 'Curriculum Council English language competence', which requires that students must obtain a grade of C or better in one of the following Year 12 Curriculum Council subjects
 - English as a Second Language
 - English Literature
- or an average of level 4 or better across two units of English
- or achieve a pass in the English language competence test

% - percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who graduated.

This column shows the number of students who graduated as a percentage of all students eligible to graduate. In some instances, students with special needs may be included in the students eligible to graduate. It may be extremely difficult for these students to complete all the requirements for graduation. In fact, it may be a commendable achievement for these students to be included as eligible to graduate.

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- The statistics of a single year should not be considered in isolation, rather the trend or pattern over a number of years should be considered.
- Small numbers of candidates at a school can bias inferences, particularly with percentages.
- The quality assurance processes associated with the TEE/WACE course examinations data ensure consistent information from year to year and from school to school. Whereas the non-TEE/WACE course examination school data are not subject to the same processes.

First 50 TEE/WACE course examination schools (75+)

Total – number of full-time students eligible to graduate who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations.

This column shows the number of students who were eligible to graduate and who had a scaled mark in 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations. Generally 4 scaled marks are required for a TER.

75+ - number of full-time students eligible to graduate who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and had at least one scaled mark greater than 75.

This column shows the number of eligible students who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and who had at least one scaled mark greater than 75. The scaled mark is used to calculate the TER.

The school assessment and raw examination mark are adjusted to the same scale and then combined on a 50:50 basis. These combined marks are then adjusted according to the relative difficulty of the subject.

% - percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and who had at least one scaled mark greater than 75.

Schools with less than 12 students in the TEE/WACE course examinations cohort are not included in the table.

Whereas the non-TEE/WACE course examination data are not subject to the same processes.

First 50 TEE Schools (Top Third)

Total – number of full-time students eligible to graduate who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations.

This column shows the number of students who were eligible to graduate and who had a scaled mark in 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations. Generally 4 scaled marks are required for a TER.

Number in top third – number of full-time students achieving an average scaled score in the top third of average scaled scores.

To calculate the scaled score for each subject, the school assessment and raw examination mark are adjusted to the same scale and then combined on a 50:50 basis. The average scaled mark for a student can then be calculated. Across the state, 33⅓% of students will populate the Low, Mid and High thirds. This statistic shows the average scaled mark achievement of students in the school compared to the state. No matter how many or few students sit 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations or how capable those students may be, there will always be a Low, Mid and High third. The performance of the students in each third is compared to all other students who sit 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and does not indicate a standard.

First 50 VET Schools

A 'VET qualification' is a qualification which is comprised of groupings of units of competency developed by industry. A 'full VET qualification' refers to completion of the grouping of units of competency for a particular qualification.

In practice, only certain courses, such as those offered at the Agricultural Colleges, lend themselves to the full completion of a VET qualification. Most VET students record a partial completion. These students complete units of competency that can be used toward the completion of a full VET qualification at a later date.

Total VET students – number of students enrolled in at least one VET unit.

This column refers to the number of full time students who enrolled in a least one VET unit of competency.

Full Quals – number of full VET qualifications completed.

This column refers to the number of VET students in the school cohort who have completed a full VET qualification.

% Full Quals – percentage of VET students completing a full VET qualification.

This column refers to the percentage of full-time eligible VET students in the school cohort who have completed a full VET qualification.

The data in this table are about the performance of students at schools and should not be used to draw simplistic inferences about the performance of schools. The following general qualifiers should be recognised:

- Many factors affect student performance, some of which are outside the control of schools. These include differences in ability, cultural and language background, educational background of parents and economic differences.
- No single table or data source should prevail in drawing inferences about the performance of students at schools. A more realistic picture is gained from a composite view of all tables.
- The statistics of a single year should not be considered in isolation, rather the trend or pattern over a number of years should be considered.
- Small numbers of candidates at a school can bias inferences, particularly with percentages.
- The quality assurance processes associated with the TEE/WACE course examination data ensure consistent information from year to year and from school to school. Whereas the non-TEE/WACE course examination school data are not subject to the same processes.

Graduation

FE - number of full-time students eligible to graduate.

A 'full-time' student is in Year 11 or 12 and has results for at least four full-year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects/course units in the current year, and in addition is eligible to graduate. A 'result' in a subject means the awarding of one of the grades (A, B, C, D, E, or U (unfinished)).

FE Grad - number of full-time students eligible to graduate who graduated.

The column refers to the number of full-time students who completed graduation requirements. Graduation means 'achievement of a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)'. To qualify for a WACE a student must:

- complete at least 10 full year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects (or equivalent);
- obtain an average grade of C or better in at least eight of the full year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects (or equivalent). At least four of these subjects must be at Year 12 level; and
- achieve 'Curriculum Council English language competence', which requires that students must obtain a grade of C or better in one of the following Year 12 Curriculum Council subjects
 - English as a Second Language
 - English Literature
- or an average of level 4 or better across two units of English
- or achieve a pass in the English language competence test

% - percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who graduated.

This column expresses the number of students who graduated as a percentage of all students eligible to graduate.

TEE/WACE course achievement

4ScMark - number full-time students eligible to graduate who sat four or more TEE subjects.

This column expresses the number of students who were eligible to graduate who had a scaled mark in four or more TEE/WACE course examinations. Generally four scaled marks are required for a TER.

% - percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who sat four or more TEE subjects.

This percentage gives an indication of the proportion of students in the school cohort who may be seeking a TER. Students who have a scaled mark in four or more TEE/WACE examinations and who have no intention of applying for university will also be included.

1+SM>75 - number of full-time students eligible to graduate who had at least one scaled mark greater than 75.

This column expresses the number of students who were eligible to graduate who had at least one scaled mark greater than 75. The scaled mark is used to calculate the TER.

The school assessment and raw examination mark are adjusted to the same scale and then combined on a 50:50 basis. These combined marks are then adjusted according to the relative difficulty of the subject.

% - percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who sat 4 or more TEE/WACE course examinations and had at least one scaled mark greater than 75.

This column expresses the proportion of students in the school cohort who were eligible to graduate who had at least one scaled mark greater than 75.

Percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who sat four or more TEE/WACE course examinations and received average scaled marks in the Low, Mid and High thirds.

The average scaled mark includes a 50% school and 50% examination component. Across the State, 33⅓% of students will populate the low, mid and high thirds. This statistic shows the average scaled mark achievement of students in the school compared to the state.

Structure workplace learning

A 'SWL subject' is a structured workplace learning subject which is wholly school-assessed, and for which there is no tertiary entrance examination developed. Achievements in these subjects do not count towards a student's tertiary entrance rank.

Percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who participated in at least one SWL subject.

The percentage gives a proportion of the cohort of students in the school (who have undertaken 10 or more D/E code subjects or equivalent) who participate in Structured

Workplace Learning. There is no way to distinguish between students who take one or more than one subject.

Number of full-time students eligible to graduate who achieved at least one A grade in at least one SWL subject.

In SWL grades are awarded for achievement in the workplace using an employer rating. The school monitors student logbooks but there is no school component to the grade.

Percentage of full-time students eligible to graduate who achieved at least one A grade in at least one SWL subject.

The percentage gives a proportion of the cohort of students in the school who achieve at least one A grade in an SWL subject. This statistic recognises the first A grade that an individual student achieves but does not indicate where multiple A grades may have been achieved.

1a Student population

This gives the number of year 12 students who completed at least one subject or equivalent and the number of repeaters, overseas students and mature age students.

Note:

'Completing' a subject is defined as obtaining either a valid grade (A, B, C, D, or E) or U notation in it or a level and band for a course unit or competence in at least one stand-alone VET unit of competency.

'Repeaters' are Year 12 students who complete at least one Curriculum Council accredited subject or equivalent in the year following enrolling in Year 12;

'Re-enterers' are Year 12 students who complete at least one Curriculum Council accredited subject or equivalent more than one year after enrolling in Year 12;

'Mature age' students were aged 19 or more on 1 March of the year in which their results were awarded.

1b Statistics on achievement of the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)

Students must satisfy three criteria to achieve the WACE. In brief,

- complete at least 10 full year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects (or equivalent);
- obtain an average grade of C or better in at least eight of the full year (or equivalent) Curriculum Council subjects (or equivalent). At least four of these subjects must be at Year 12 level; and
- achieve 'Curriculum Council English language competence', which requires that students must obtain a grade of C or better in one of the following Year 12 Curriculum Council subjects
 - English as a Second Language
 - English Literature
- or an average of level 4 or better across two units of English
- or achieve a pass in the English language competence test

The fully detailed requirements for achievement of the WACE, including the use of course units, VET units of competency, semesterised subjects, credit for overseas or interstate education in Year 11 and recognition of prior learning may be found in *Information Paper for the Western Australian Certificate of Education and Statement of Results, 2006* and also on our website at <http://www.curriculum.wa.edu.au/pages/publication00.htm#6>.

It has been agreed, in consultation with stakeholders, that the percentage of graduating students should be calculated from a base population consisting only of those full-time Year 12 students who could have achieved the WACE (if they had achieved at a suitable level). The population of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE is also used as a base when calculating the numbers of TEE/WACE examination students, WSA students, course unit students and VET students.

1c TEE/WACE examination students

These are defined as full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE, who obtained four or more scaled marks. Normally, students aspiring to enter university need at least four scaled marks in order to obtain a TER.

A student with scaled marks of 75 or more has demonstrated academic achievement in approximately the top 10 percent of students aiming to be admitted to university.

1d WSA students

These students are defined as full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE, who took at least 3 wholly school-assessed subjects (inclusive of structured workplace learning, but not of stand-alone/non-embedded VET modules or units of competency). These school-assessed subjects may be E-code (Year 12 level) or D-code (Year 11 level). In most cases these students are not able to obtain a TER, so they may be regarded as not aspiring to university study in the following year.

Note that a 'result' can be any one of the notations A, B, C, D, E or U, whereas a 'grade' does not include the U result (U = unfinished).

1e WACE course unit students

These students are defined as full-time students who are eligible to achieve the WACE, and who obtained results in at least 2 course units.

1f VET students

There is, as yet, no exclusive definition of a 'VET' student. Students in this category may also belong to 1C, 1D or 1E.

2. TEE subjects/WACE examination course

This table gives the distribution of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE, by the number of TEE subjects/WACE examination course (in 2006 – Aviation) taken by each of them. Subtotals show the number of students who took enough subjects/course to obtain a Tertiary Entrance Rank (at least 4, assuming that subject/course list requirements and prerequisites were satisfied) and the number who did not. The number of TEE subjects/WACE examination course 'taken' by a student is defined as the number of scaled marks (or combined mark, in the case of ESL) obtained.

3. WSA subjects

This table gives the distribution of full-time students eligible to graduate, by the number of wholly school-assessed (WSA) subjects completed by each of them.

4. VET studies

For 2007, Vocational Education and Training (VET) studies consisted of structured workplace learning (SWL), a subset of WSA subjects, and units of competency. VET studies count towards achievement of the WACE. Some units of competency are integrated/embedded in Curriculum Council subjects/courses, and others are stand-alone, or non-embedded. Where units of competency are integrated/embedded in Curriculum Council subjects/course units, care must be taken to avoid counting them twice.

4a shows the distribution of subject equivalents achieved for units of competency amongst full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE. A total of 55 nominal hours of stand-alone/non-embedded units of competency is equivalent to 0.5 subject, up to a maximum of 2 subject equivalents.

4b shows the distribution of participation in E-code SWL amongst full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE.

5. WACE course units

This table gives the distribution of full-time students eligible to graduate, by the number of Course units completed by each of them.

6. Summary of students' results by grades for subjects

This table shows the number and percentage of year 12 students awarded each of the grades (A, B, C, D and E) for each subject. In addition, statistical tests have been carried out to compare:

- males against females within the school group and within the State;
- the school group against the whole State cohort.

Under the heading **Better Performing Group** the following entries may be found.
